Title IX at PTSA

Title IX is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex, including on the basis of sex stereotypes, in education programs and activities. All colleges and universities that receiv e federal funds must comply with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972,20 U.S.C. §§ 1681 e t seq. and its implementing regulations, 34 C.F.R. Part 106.

Because harassment, including sexual harassment, is prohibited by federal and state laws, PTSA strictly forbids harassment of any kind, and will swiftly take appropriate action to address any violations of this policy. Harassment is any verbal (can include verbal taunting, including racial and ethnic slurs) or physical conduct designed to threaten, intimidate, or coerce.

Harassing conduct may take many forms, including verbal acts and name calling; graphic and written statements, which may include use of cell phones or the Internet; or other conduct that may be phy sically threatening, harmful, or humiliating. Harassment does not have to include intent to harm, be directed at a specific target, or involve repeated incidents.

Harassment creates a hostile environment when the conduct is sufficiently severe, pervasive, or persis tent so as to interfere with or limit a student's ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or opportunities offered by school. When such harassment is based on race, color, national origin, sex, or disability, it violates the civil rights laws that the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) enforces.

Students or employees who believe that they are, or have been, subject to any behaviors or conduct that can be classified as gender-based violence, harassment, stalking or any of the broad range of b ehaviors directed at the victim such as actions that harass, frighten, seriously alarm, threaten, terroriz e, torment, and/or force another into the life of the victim, should immediately contact our Title IX Coordinators:
